RAINBOW
RELATING INTERNATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS TO EQF



- To develop criteria relating the International Welding Qualification to the EQF (from EQF level 2 to 7) ;
- To establish a common methodology for the definition of learning outcomes (LOs) and standard procedures to align International Qualifications with the EQF;
- To create a ground of trust regarding the European Welding Core Profiles and Qualifications (EW, EWP, EWS, EWT and EWE) in order to support recognition for other sectors.

1. Quality Assurance procedures from the design to the awarding stage.
2. Learning outcomes as descriptors for the qualifications.
3. Involve all relevant stakeholders in all stages.
4. Procedures for continuous improvement/update of the qualifications.
5. IQ embedding modular approaches and flexible pathways.

Experience and Expertise

(3) Additional Criteria

1. Quality of training delivery.
2. Quality of the examinations.
3. Quality control of the organisation performing the examination.
4. Ownership of the qualification.
5. Relevance for the labour market.
