1. Quality Assurance procedures from the design to the awarding stage.

2. Learning outcomes as descriptors for the qualifications.

3. Involve all relevant stakeholders in all stages.

4.Procedures for continuous improvement/update of the qualifications.

5. IQ embedding modular approaches and flexible pathways.


(3) Additional Criteria
